Block #20 – This Is It!

Cutting

Blue fabric:

Two 3 ½" x 5"

Green fabric:

Two 3 ½" x 5"

White fabric:

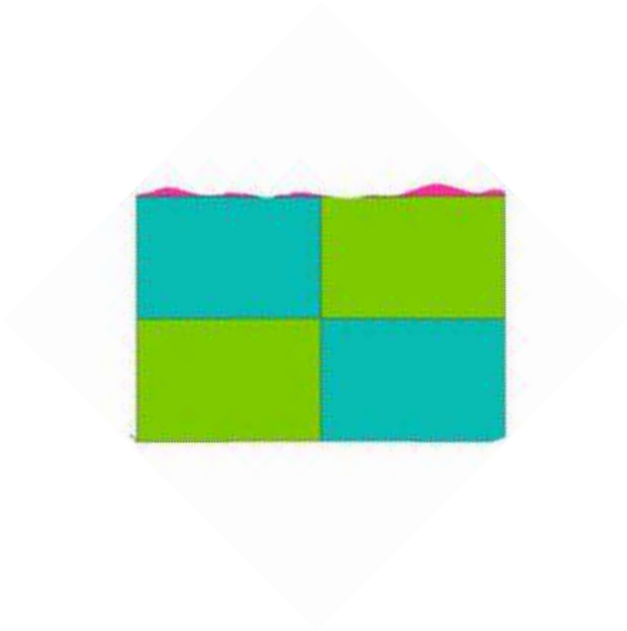
14" square

Pink fabric:

3 ½" x 9 ½"

Sew a blue and green rectangle together along the 3 ½" side. Repeat.

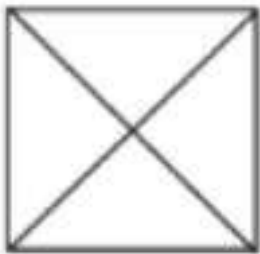
Sew the two blue/green units together as shown.



Sew the pink rectangle to the top. Now trim to 9" square. There isn't really a right or wrong way to trim this square. You can decide if you want it symmetrical, or want more pink etc, just make a 9" square.

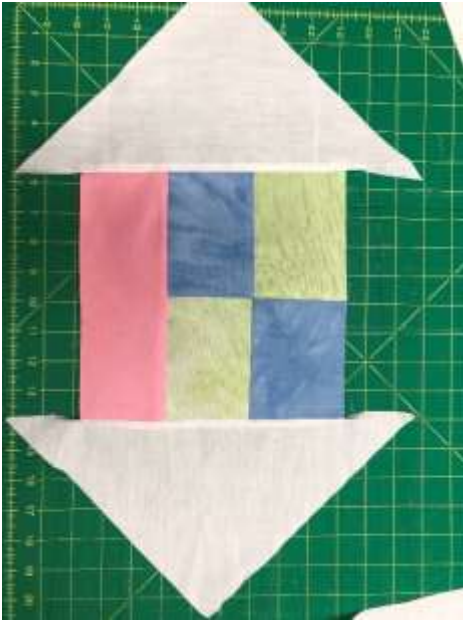


Cut the white 14" square across from corner to corner, and then again in the other corner to corner.



Sew one white triangle onto one side (using the longest side of triangle), letting the tails hang out evenly on each side. A good way is to find the center of the long side of triangle and centre of block and match up.

Press. Repeat for opposite side. Press.

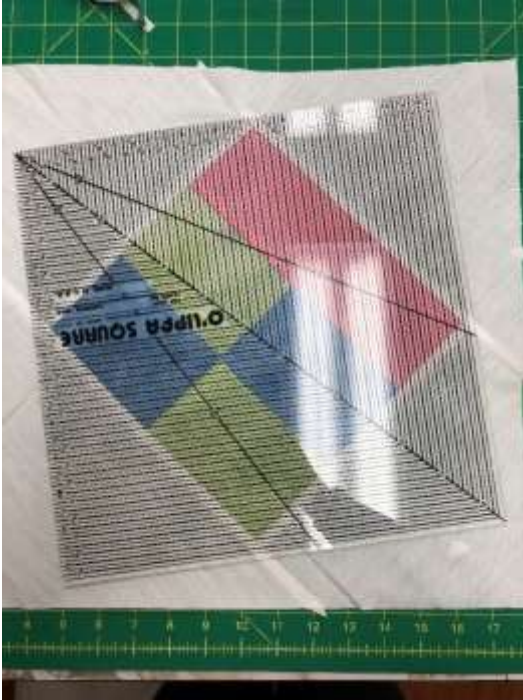


Trim the tails off.

Sew last two triangles on. Press, now you have a really big block.



Use your 12 ½” square or make a template of one and place on the block. You can make it funky or line up so each ‘corner’ of the coloured block has a good ¼” seam allowance.



Cut to 12 ½”
